


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Patient-Reported Indicators Survey (PaRIS)

This year, Value in Health successfully led the Saudi Arabia's implementation of the OECD's Patient-Reported Indicators Survey (PaRIS), a major milestone in the Kingdom's efforts to measure and improve health system value. Over 15,000 patients and 100 providers across the Ministry of Health, other Governmental sectors and private primary care providers participated, making this the first project to generate such comprehensive patient-reported outcome measures. The initiative's flagship report, Does Healthcare Deliver? Results from the Patient-Reported Indicator Surveys, comparing results from multiple par-

ticipant countries including Saudi Arabia, is scheduled for publication in early 2025.



Leveraging Coordination and Promoting Equity:

Lessons for Improving Value Across G20 Health Systems

In this report, the Hub identified coordination and equity as two priorities for strategic invest-

ment to strengthen health systems and advance high-value care. The study, which included

case studies from countries including Saudi Arabia, Brazil, Italy and the United Kingdom, was

produced in collaboration with the Lemann Foundation Program at Oxford University.

Drivers and Barriers for the Implementation of Value-Based Healthcare in Latin America

In collaboration with the Global Initiative on Health and the Economy and the University of Miami, the Hub published a report on opportunities to enhance value-based care adoption in Latin America, with particular focus on the health systems of Brazil, Mexico and Argentina.










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Tomorrow's Health System Today: The Need for High-Value Health Systems in Promoting Health and Optimizing Care Delivery in the Midst of Climate Change

Spending Well: Principles for Measuring Efficiency in the Health System of Saudi Arabia

How should health system efficiency be defined and measured? This report outlined a practical framework for measuring health system efficiency and highlighted the importance of aligning efficiency initiatives with the broader goal of achieving system value. Recognizing the different perspectives of funders, payors and providers, the report recommended an integrated approach to transformation, considering efficiency alongside other health system goals such as equity and quality.

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Value in Health's second annual conference focused on transformative healthcare strategies, improving patient clinician interactions, public health strategies and value-based healthcare implementation. Renowned speakers, including international and local experts, shared insighted into fostering better patient engagement, leveraging preventive health measures and using patient reported-outcomes to enhance care quality.



Value in Health's conference was part of the program for the 2024 Global Health Exhibition in Riyadh. In addition to value-based health and care, themes for the presentations and discussions, this event also included investing in health, future health horizons and clinical excellence. Over 100 hours of continuing medical education were offered in the scientific program. In the exhibition, Value in Health's insights and resources were shared at its well-attended exhibition stand.







Value in Health has hosted the secretariat of the Global Innovation Hub for Improving Value in Health since the Hub's establishment in 2020. This year, the Hub was invited to facilitate a plenary session with G20 delegates during the 3rd Health Working Group Meeting in Salvador, Brazil. The closed plenary session discussed the critical importance of value in health, spotlighted the work of the Hub and previewed its upcoming work program, both with the G20 and across other global health forums.



Prioritizing Effective Coordination and Equity to Building Resilient Health Systems

In partnership with the Lehmann Foundation Program at Oxford University, the Hub hosted a side event to the 4th Brazil G20 Health Working Group meeting. This event brought together delegates from national governments, international organizations and academia to discuss key insights and policy recommendations featured in the Hub report Leveraging Coordination and Promoting Equity: Lessons for Improving Value Across G20 Health Systems.









Valuing Patient Voices

Value in Health hosted an expert roundtable on patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs) in Riyadh in July 2024. This event brought together more than 50 leaders across health sectors to reflect on progress to date and chart a path forward on the effective use of PROMs in the Saudi health system. The discussion highlighted that greater standardization, coordination and investment were needed to fully realize the promise of PROMs.



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




From Data to Wisdom: Realizing Better Value in the Saudi Health System


In collaboration with NUPCO and the Health Sector Transformation Program, Value in Health co-hosted a high-level seminar in November 2024. The session brought together senior policymakers, regulators and healthcare leaders to hear a presentation from Robert S. Kaplan, Senior Fellow and Marvin Bower Professor of Leadership Development Emeritus at Harvard Business School on how Saudi Arabia's health system could move beyond data collection toward data-informed decisions to drive better value.





Fourth High-Level Ministerial Conference on Antimicrobial Resistance

The Fourth Global High-Level Ministerial Conference on Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR), held in Jeddah, aimed to accelerate international cooperation in combating the urgent challenge of AMR. An area of particular focus was the One Health approach, an integrative perspective addressing AMR across human, animal and environmental health sectors. The conference benefitted from a wide range of contributions including those from patients, academia and the public and private sectors.







Education, Training and Collaboration

Building the competencies of policymakers and healthcare professionals to deliver better value is central to the mission of Value in Health. In 2024, ViH delivered education and training programs online and in-person to a range of policymaker and practitioner audiences. ViH also enhances the capability of the Saudi health ecosystem through its collaborations, most notably with its role in the Value Network.



Value Vanguard

The Value Vanguard initiative aimed to empower healthcare leaders to adopt and promote value-based healthcare in their own organizations. The inaugural Value Vanguard workshop brought together leaders to explore clinical change through two real-world case studies, one on redesigning care pathways, the other on using data analytics to drive improvement.





Value in Health Network

This year, the Value in Health Network - organizations that share the common goal to enable the health system in Saudi Arabia to deliver superior value - continued to strengthen its role as a catalyst for system transformation. The Network shared current progress and good practices, with one key contribution being its support of Value in Health's annual conference. The Network expanded from seven to 11 organizations, reflecting its commitment to inclusivity and multisectoral collaboration.

United Kingdom Study Tour


In February 2024, Value in Health undertook a week-long mission to gain insights from think tanks, academic institutes, thought leaders and leading healthcare providers in the United Kingdom. The visit included workshops and interviews in Wales, London, Oxford and Edinburgh and covered topics including value-based care models, health policy innovation, and organizational best practices for think tanks and knowledge centers.
